Mildmay was founded over 150 years ago to serve the people of London's poorest slums. The charity is once again refocussing on the needs of those across the capital and beyond who have the least, in pioneering new pathways.

Mildmay Mission Hospital remains committed to bringing about a new beginning for every person we serve, when they are in greatest need, and when no one else can be there for them.

Pivotal changes continue to take place at Mildmay Mission Hospital as we work with our partners, NHS England, the Ministers for Health and Social Care, the Healthy London Partnership and our family of NHS Acute Hospitals across London. We continue to expand our services to address the most pressing needs of vulnerable people living with HIV, the homeless and those with alcohol and drug addiction.

Over the past year, our charity has had a vital role in London's response to the COVID-19 pandemic, caring for people with HIV, as well as providing new services for homeless step-down patients and those recovering from COVID-19 and we have demonstrated that we can operate under the most challenging conditions.

It is not yet certain that Mildmay can continue to provide HIV care in addition to the step-down hospital care for the homeless, but this is our hope. Our partner charities involved in both HIV and homeless work across the capital, the UK and beyond strongly support us in the negotiations with our health commissioners.

We hope and pray that we are successful and that this will be the bedrock of Mildmay's work going forward in the United Kingdom, the Lord being our helper.
